A SUCCESSFUL ACADEMIC CAREER

At university, you're in charge of your own success. Course attendance and personal study are key factors, but there are also many UBO resources available to help you:

- Welcome day
- Induction week, when you can familiarize yourself with academic study skills
- Personal tutors on hand to help you throughout the year
- CAP'AVENIR (careers advisory service)
- 12 university libraries open most days until 10 pm. In addition to general services, we offer introductory courses on documentary research and digital resources.

THE DIGITAL CAMPUS

Wi-Fi is available on all University campuses.

- The online digital workspace (ENT) provides many resources to help you organize and manage your studies: the digital timetable, (also accessible via mobile phones), is perfect for staying up-to-date with course times and room changes, and the e-learning platform gives you access to educational resources from any Internet connection.
- You may wish to subscribe to a selection of thematic "virtual universities" and "digital libraries" to deepen your knowledge or simply to satisfy your curiosity! UBO has designed its own virtual librarian (ubib.fr) accessible 24/7 to answer your queries. This service is also available via chat.
- Brest's "digital canteen" (of which UBO is a founding member) helps you to develop hi-tech entrepreneurship projects.

MOVING TO BREST
